To be eligible to apply for this scholarship, the applicant must be:

- An Australian Citizen or Australian Permanent Humanitarian Visa Holder, or Australian Permanent Resident or New Zealand Citizen;
- A current Year 12 student at Sarina State High School, graduating in 2024;
- Have selected or will select a JCU eligible course* as first preference through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC);
- A student that has received consistently high levels of academic achievement throughout their high school studies and expected to achieve an ATAR of less than 95.

Nominated by: Students self-nominate by completing the application form.

Determined by: Sarina State High Schools Principal, three Deputy Principals and Guidance Officer

*A JCU eligible course is all undergraduate bachelor and joint degrees offered by JCU at the Townsville Mackay and Cairns campuses, excluding the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) and Bachelor of Dental Surgery.

The JCU Rising Star Scholarship includes:

- \$10,000 paid directly to the recipient in instalments over three years;
- JCU Rising Star Scholarship Certificate;
- The recipient may be offered paid casual employment at JCU in their first year of study.





Eligibility Criteria

Recipient Selection

The process of selecting the JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipient is to be determined by the school under the following eligibility criteria. Schools are to submit the JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipient details by Friday 11 October 2024.

To be eligible for the JCU Rising Star Scholarship, students need to be:

- An Australian Citizen or Australian Permanent Humanitarian Visa Holder, or Australian Permanent Resident or New Zealand Citizen
- A current Year 12 student at your school
- Have selected or will select a JCU eligible course* as first preference through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC)
- Have received consistently high levels of academic achievement throughout their high school studies and expected to achieve an ATAR of less than 95. Students with an ATAR of 95+ are eligible for the JCU Vice Chancellor's and Deans' Scholarships.

*A JCU eligible course is all undergraduate bachelor and joint degrees offered by JCU at the Townsville, Cairns and Mackay campuses, excluding the Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS), and Bachelor of Dental Surgery.

Recipient Notification

The JCU Rising Star Scholarship is formally announced at the end of year School's Presentation Ceremony or similar event.

A JCU representative may be available to present at the end of year School's Presentation Ceremony or similar event.

Recipient Confirmation and Award

JCU will confirm receipt of the JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipient after 11 October with the school staff member making the submission. JCU will issue the school an award recipient pack containing:

- JCU Rising Star Scholarship Award Certificate
- A Scholarship Instruction letter
- QTAC Application Fee Voucher and Undergraduate Course Guide.

How to Receive the JCU Rising Star Scholarship

Following the presentation, JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipients will receive further information from the Scholarships Office on how to receive award payments. To receive payment, JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipients are to:

- 1. Accept their offer to study at James Cook University in 2025
- Upon successful admission, enrol in subjects in the first available teaching period in 2025
- Complete the Student Creditor Form and submit to the Scholarships office.

Condition of Award

Funds will be directly paid into the recipient's nominated bank account in instalments with the following conditions:

- 1. The recipient accepts their offer of admission and successfully enrols in full-time study at JCU in the preceding year the JCU Rising Star Scholarship is awarded
- 2. Not be in receipt of any other JCU Scholarship or Award; and
- 3. Maintain full-time enrolment and credit average whilst in receipt of the Scholarship.

Special Consideration

Students may apply for special consideration to defer their commencement for up to one year. Students may be required to provide supporting documentation to support this consideration.

Award Payments

The JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipient will receive \$10,000 paid in instalments after Census dates by the below schedule:

- Year 1 2 x \$2,000 payments after successful full-time enrolment in Semester 1 and Semester 2
- Year 2 2 x \$2,000 payments after successful fulltime enrolment in Semester 1 and Semester 2
- Year $3 2 \times $1,000$ payments after successful fulltime enrolment in Semester 1 and Semester 2.

Additional Attributes

The JCU Rising Star Scholarship recipient may be offered casual employment, as a Student Ambassador, in the first year of JCU study.
