- Ensure 100% of Year 12 students leave school with a suitable pathway - QCE, QCIA, OP and/or VET qualification.
- Improve the literacy outcomes (Writing) of all students.
- Improve whole school attendance.
- Deliver high quality teaching in every classroom every day across the school.

Our initiatives include

- Strengthening the case management and tracking approach to senior students on a QCE or QCIA pathway.
- Developing a whole school approach to teaching literacy to support teaching across all learning areas.
- Refining the school pedagogical framework (ASOT) and embedding it as the shared language of teaching and learning.
- Providing professional development for teachers and school leaders to increase capability to initiate and implement innovative practices in the classroom.
- Building teacher capability to differentiate and improve learning outcomes for all students.
- Identifying and extending high performing students across all learning areas, in particular Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).
- Utilising digital pedagogies across the curriculum.
