

Rugby League Behavioural Standards

As outlined to all students who selected the Rugby League Program as a subject in 2019; there will be a **five week trial** period to determine the suitability of all students entering the program. This trial period is aimed at ensuring all students abide by the rules associated with being a part of the Sarina State High School Rugby League Program which involves high behavioural expectations across all subjects and school environments. It must be made clear that participating in Rugby League at Sarina State High School is a privilege, not a right and as a school community we expect Rugby League students to lead by example in regards to the way they conduct themselves when representing our school.

The following factors will be monitored and taken into consideration throughout the four week trial period and also throughout the year:


- Behaviour and effort standard in Rugby League class
- Behaviour and effort standard in all other subjects
- Suspensions

If any student/s have not followed the outlined rules and expectations during the trial period or **during the school year**, their place in the program will be reviewed with removal from the program remaining a considered consequence.

Please note that Rugby League ability **is not** considered when determining a student's suitability. Students who uphold the high expectations of the Sarina State High School Rugby League Program will remain a valuable part of the group, regardless of skill level or previous experience.

Before any student is considered for removal from the Rugby League Program the following steps will be taken:

- Verbal discussion with the student outlining possible consequences
- Parent phone call outlining possible consequences
- Final written letter outlining consequences and another parent phone call
- Removal from the program



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
